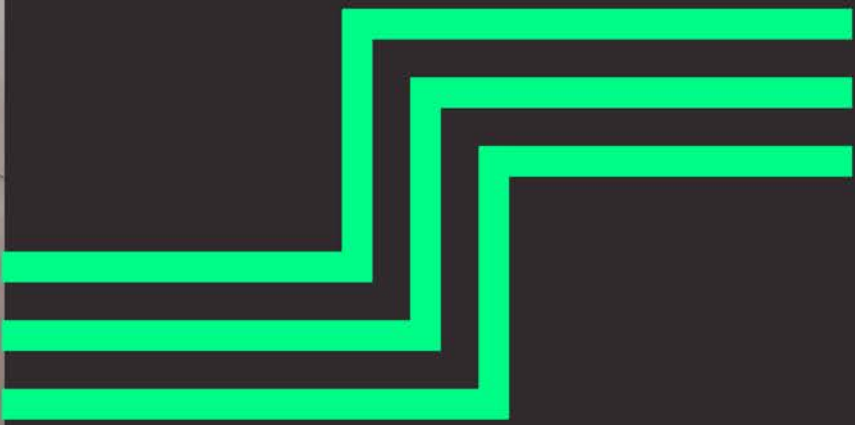

# 2022 CEO Letter

Otherwise known as the year that we took off our masks and started spending a little more one on one time with one another. A little more.

As the world began to open up, at Big Brothers Big Sisters, we hoped to see a return to normal where we were able to match many of the rapidly increasing number of youth who were applying to be matched with a Big Brother or Sister. Instead, we found that while people could spend more time in person with others they were not choosing to do so. Society had made a “new normal”. This new normal was seen nationwide. Fewer people were offering to volunteer, “The rate of formal volunteering through organizations dropped by seven percentage points, from 30 percent in 2019 to 23.2 percent in 2021, during the COVID-19 pandemic.”

For BBBS this meant that we needed to take a new approach to the recruiting and marketing of volunteers. We decided to go grass roots as well as continuing to grow our vibrant social media presence. We chose to start going to where the people are: local bars and restaurants, outdoor festivals, Miami classrooms and even Top Golf. We are open to recruiting wherever people are congregating. We are out there like never before! We created a group of Big Ambassadors to help spread the word. Want to join?

Our views on social media of all kinds are being closely monitored and we are starting to see growth in volunteering. If you follow us, you will see many unique and different sides of mentoring. The stories we have been telling are both heartwarming and meaningful. Our Board is full to capacity with wonderful, diverse volunteers. We are fully (and excellently) staffed. For the first time ever, in 2022 we were able to offer health insurance to our Staff.

We continue to be thankful to our many donors and funders who stayed solidly behind us all throughout the pandemic. While we still work hard to make sure the money keeps flowing to fund our evidenced based best practice mentoring program, we are fortunate to be stable financially.

So, overall BBBS is in great shape to tackle the future...now if we could just change that stubborn recruitment issue. **WE NEED VOLUNTEERS!** We are out there and will be even more so throughout 2023. Find us and tell us you will step up to be a Big Brother or a Big Sister. Many of the youth waiting to be matched at BBBS wait almost a year to be matched. If you are a boy, it may be even longer. This is not right. No one should have to wait to have a person in their life just for them, just to help them grow to be a strong adult. They need you.

# Our Programs

## Community-Based Program

Our Community-Based Program matched children and youth with a supportive adult, who provided a one-on-one mentoring relationship by meeting their match two to four times each month. Community-Based matches had the opportunity to participate in our new affinity-based programs- Art Buddies and Sports Buddies- as well as our career-focused program for teens called Big Futures. These programs provided periodic outings and activities for matches that reflected their specific interest.

## Site-Based Program

Our Site-Based Program matched elementary school children with mentors who are high school students, college students, or adults from the community. These matches met once each week during the school year in a group setting led by Big Brothers Big Sisters Program Coordinators.

## Club of Unmatched Littles (COUL)

Through COUL, our agency facilitated outings for unmatched Littles such as a cooking demonstration through OSU Extension, a family picnic at Millikin Park, a fall visit to Jewett Farm, and a trip to Kings Island.

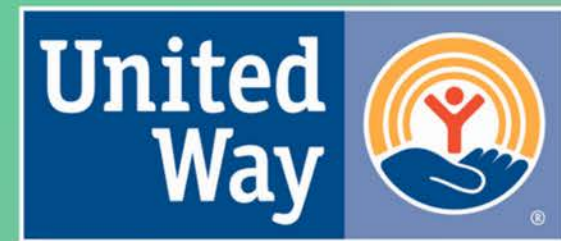
