
In the previous year, we assisted 354 children through a mix of site-based, community-based, and Club of Unmatched Littles (COUL) activities. We hosted 10 events for COUL, supported nine site-based programs in Butler County elementary schools, and facilitated over 150 community-based matches.

## IN 2023 WE SERVED...

231 children matched with a Big Brother/Big Sister

63 children served through COUL (Club of Unmatched Littles)

60 High School student Big Brothers/Big Sisters

354 children served in BBBS of Butler County

94 % improved or maintained academic performances/school grades

98% improved or maintained their ability to express feelings

85% improved or maintained emotion regulation

100% had no police and juvenile justice contact

99% of youth avoided risky behaviors such as bullying, school discipline, illegal activity, and substance abuse









